The holiest time in the Christian year is Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. Join us to celebrate Christ's ultimate act of self-giving love – his death and resurrection.

There are 40 days in Lent, not counting Sundays. So whatever you might give up or take on, you have a day off during each week on Sundays.

The word "Lent" comes from an Old English word, "Lencten," which means spring. As we enter Lent consider what God is calling you to do or to be during Lent. There are plenty of ways to enrich your experience during this holy season.

Lent

Holy Week

Palm / Passion Sunday:

April 5 at 8:30 am and 10 am

The 8:30 service will take place in the church as usual. The 10 service begins outside with the Palm Sunday gospel of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. We process in, and Palm Sunday turns into Passion Sunday as we remember Jesus' last tumultuous week in Jerusalem with the dramatic reading of the gospel.

Wednesday, April 8 at 6 pm

View the 2018 production "Jesus Christ Superstar Live" on Wednesday of Holy Week. The one hour and forty minute video will be viewed in the Bethlehem rooms at 6 pm. The setting is the final week of Christ's ministry.

Maundy Thursday: April 9 at 7 pm

We remember Jesus' last night with his disciples: the Last Supper and the great commandment to "love one another as I have loved you," demonstrated by the washing of feet. The blessed sacrament will be processed to the Altar of Repose in the Chapel and an all-night vigil will begin. People may sign up for an hour to "sit and watch" with Jesus as his disciples did in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Good Friday: April 10 at 12 pm & 7 pm

Services of deep devotion to remember Jesus' gift of his life on the cross. The Passion of St. John's Gospel will be read by parishioners. Come be a part of this dramatic re-enactment of Jesus' final hours.

Easter Vigil: Saturday, April 11 at 7 pm

The solemn, traditional service of the Easter Vigil celebrates the moment that Easter comes to Nativity. We begin with the first fire of Easter outside in the garden. We process inside by candlelight and read the stories of salvation history. We renew our baptismal vows and experience the dawning of Easter.

Wayne's World

In the storyline arc of any people's history, there comes a time when society's problems must find a solution (otherwise how can we live happily ever after?). The

books of Samuel tell of the years when Israel's self-inflicted chaos of the 12th Century BCE finds a divine resolve in the kingship of David. In fact, these narratives can even be considered a pro-Davidic polemic, due to the way the story is so skewed.

In First Samuel, David is presented as the future king who leads an almost charmed life as he follows the divine path to the throne: indeed he can do no wrong. The inevitability of God's will coming through regardless of how we, God's people, mess

things up is the overall theme of the narratives. Our lives today are greatly informed by this prophetic journey of God and God's people. Think about it. The problems we experience in life are almost entirely self-inflicted—if we are totally honest with ourselves. Growing toward maturity means accepting the solution that is provided by God—unfortunately, we can't get out of our own way most of the time!

The books of Samuel address this reality, which is extremely salient in our own day and age. Bible Study Wednesday takes an in-depth look at this portion of scripture with an eye toward seeing the divine hand in our own lives. All are welcome to join in this study at 6:30 pm and close with the prayers of Compline by 7:30.

What is a Global Village trip?

A Global Village trip is a short-term service trip where you can volunteer abroad with Habitat for Humanity. All trips vary based on the country and itinerary, but all of them include a mix of work, rest and free time. It is our desire that these trips not only utilize your skills to build safe, affordable houses in places where they are desperately needed, but also give you the opportunity to see another culture up-close and live like a local.

Why we build

Due to economic necessity and tradition, extended families in Jordan tend to live together, resulting in 12 to 15 people sharing a small two-room house. Overcrowded living conditions and a lack of privacy endanger the health and well-being of families. Additionally, women struggle to cook in makeshift kitchens with dirt floors, which results in improperly stored food that can attract pests and rodents. Habitat for Humanity Jordan works with the local community to provide housing solutions to these families in need of healthy, affordable homes.

Project Description

Volunteers assist families by building new homes of concrete block. Typical volunteer tasks may include mixing mortar and concrete, building walls, moving materials and cutting, bending and tying rebar.

What to expect

Volunteers arrive at Queen Alia International Airport and are taken to a local hotel for the night. The following morning, teams travel to the project location and begin working that afternoon. Teams stay in a guesthouse that has dorm-style rooms and shared bathrooms. You'll truly be off the grid - there is no internet access during the week. Each evening, teams enjoy dinner with local families. Additional cultural opportunities throughout the week could include visiting the Dead Sea or archeological sites.

Highlights

This trip allows volunteers the unique opportunity to immerse themselves in a new culture as they share meaningful conversation over meals each evening with community members. Habitat staff says Jordan is one of the top if not the top experience Global Village travelers have across the world. It is a very safe country with hospitality that is above and beyond.

The Confirmation Service will be held at Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in downtown Phoenix on Saturday, May 9, 2020 at 10:00AM.

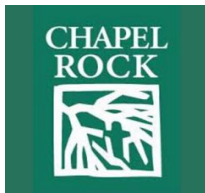

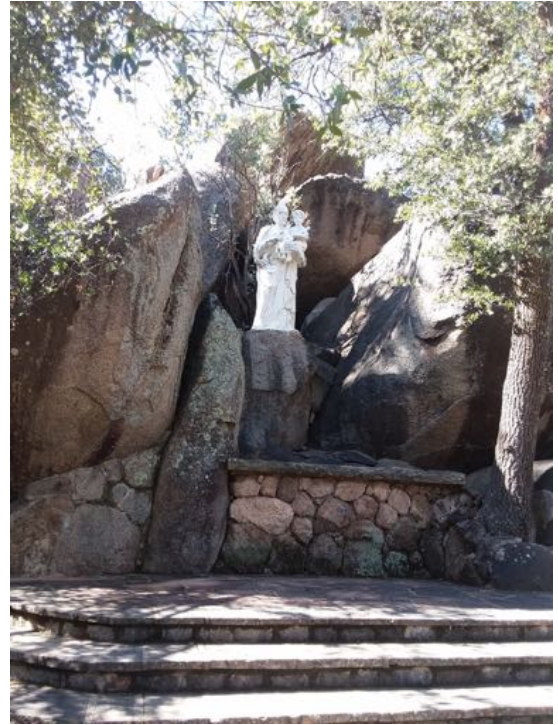
Summer Serve - July 6-10, 2020

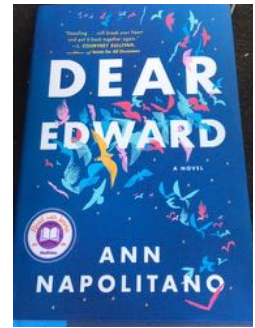
