

On November 17, The Feast Day of Endicott Peabody, St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Tombstone, AZ celebrated their Founder's Day. Bishop Jennifer Reddall made her first outing after her son's stroke and she was in great form.

Founded in 1882, St. Paul's is the oldest Protestant church in Arizona and the first Episcopal mission established in Arizona. The Founding Vicar was Endicott Peabody, Cotty Peabody's great-grandfather.

The Bishop, Andrea and Cotty as well as Deacon Heather Rose rode through Tombstone much the way it might have been done in 1882.

Following that there was a breakfast for the parish, a service of Confirmation and the Blessing of a new altar followed by yet another wonderful meal.





The next time you are in Tombstone stop by St. Paul's Episcopal Church and check out the historic church and the connection to the Peabody family!

Do take advantage of this wonderful opportunity of a middle-of-the-week reconnection to the energy that truly saves and refreshes. Wednesday Holy Communion happens on December 4, 11 and 18 at 6:00 pm. As we invite the coming of our Lord, let us be prepared to receive Him.

Nativity's newest outreach ministry has made a great start this year. For next year we have expanded the number of trips to the East Valley Men's Center to 15 dinners for 2020. We have also expanded the leadership team for this ministry with the addition of Ron and Ramona Rusinak, and Carrie Wagner. This will bring better organization and service as well as new ideas to this wonderful ministry. Next summer we are going to try a Bar-B-Que dinner.

We finish out 2019 with a MEATLOAF dinner on December 15th and start out the new year on January 4th with a CHILI dinner. Both of these are great cold weather meals. If you haven't experienced the warm feeling that comes with serving a hot meal to a bunch of hungry men who are working to get back on their feet again, by all means sign up for the next meal. You won't be disappointed.

And speaking of cold weather, the men loved, and I suspect have started using, the hats that the knitting ministry made for them. Since the residents are allowed only 90 days at the Center, next winter will bring new men and a new opportunity for the knitting ministry (hint, hint).

The director of the Shelter suggested a new idea to help support the men and that is with toiletry products. Next year we will set up a drop-off collection bin for soap, shampoo, etc., that we will take to the shelter on a monthly basis. So, when you are travelling, don't be afraid to pick up those unused bars of soap and shampoo from the hotel rooms. The men of the East Valley Men's Center will be grateful.




