
Recently, I have appointed a Search Committee for the Music Director position and am grateful the following people have agreed to serve on this committee: Mark Dobbins, Chair; Charles Cornner; Mary Ann Rank; Jo Taylor; and Christa Van Zant.

I also am honored and delighted to welcome Charles Cornner as our Interim Music Director. He will serve for several months until a new Music Director is hired. The Search Committee will make a recommendation to me, probably during mid-Lent, and the appointment will then be formalized.

Charles is the perfect fit for the interim position as he has years of experience in the music field and knows the Nativity community well. Here is some information about his background:

Charles Cornner is originally from Manhattan Beach, California and was baptized and confirmed at St. Cross by the Sea Episcopal Church in Hermosa Beach, California. He holds a Bachelor of Music Degree in Vocal Performance from California State University, Northridge, and a Master of Music Degree in Choral Music Education from Arizona State University.

We have several good candidates who have already applied for the position. Once pre-screening is finished for each candidate and a file is complete with their resume/cv and audio or video recordings, the Search Committee will begin interviewing candidates via Zoom.

Toward the end of the search process, two or three finalists will be invited to visit Nativity and meet the choir so they may participate in the search process and give their input.

Please keep the search committee in your prayers as we discern who will be the next Music Director of The Episcopal Church of the Nativity.

Wayne's World January 2021

Growing up Baptist I
was impressed with how
the Bible was treated. I
heard sermons where
preachers would try and squeeze

every bit of theological juice out of it like an overripe orange. Every Sunday featured Bible study in a Sunday School for all ages, although I found it odd that the senior adults were divided into men's classes and women's classes. One thing that bothered me was how there always seemed to be an overreach in making every passage essentially mean the same thing—and it always agreed with the viewpoint of the preacher or teacher.

My foray into biblical studies in seminary led me to get a PhD in New Testament with an area of concentration in Old Testament literature. My interest was to transcend the parochial understandings of my Baptist teachers and set the biblical narrative free to tell us what needed to be heard, even if it was uncomfortable.

There's a lot to love in the Bible; there's also a lot that we could do without—much like life. Bible Study when done right trains the mind in garnering understanding and forces us to take a viewpoint that is frequently wider and bigger than we're inclined to have. This step is necessary if we ever expect to supersede the limitations of our upbringing. Discipleship is a journey of discovery of who we truly are. The Scriptures reveal this reality in stories and oracles and epistles that

require our interaction. The road to our heightened sense of divinity, the divinity that is implicit in our created humanity, goes through the revealed Word.

Our ability as disciples of God's Christ to "rightly divide" the word of truth lies as a matter of utmost importance in growing in Divine Love. It is the beginning of our experience of peace on earth and good will towards everyone.



4 Things for your calendar!

A note from Mandy:

I'm starting off 2021 assuming all the best, but having a back up plan for the worst. I hope with my whole heart that we are back together in-person for our regular gatherings so soon!!... but if we are not, I will do all that I can to help us all feel connected online. Here are some things I'm planning for this spring...

1 Doing Good Together - A four week focus on empathy, kindness, and sharing.

We are starting 2021 with a series geared toward some big life conversations! Using some resources from the organization Doing Good Together, who (as they say), "helps families practice kindness together", we will learn about poverty, inclusion, volunteering, and charity on a level kids can understand. Recently, you may have heard me looking for God at the grocery store. Or, more recently trying to find Mary - I found her on the cover of National Geographic magazine. Where have you found her?


Well, every Thursday morning our knitting group meets for socializing, prayer, knitting, and whether they know it or not, we are looking for God in our knitting. God is there in prayers knit into every stitch, some prayers verbal and some silent. And we laugh, and we laugh, because we know God has a sense of humor, too.

We usually share a reflection by the author Stephanie Pearl-McPhee from her book *Things I Learned from Knitting* whether I wanted to or not. I share my love of knitting and life with her, and like me, she thrives on living in the metaphor. Turns out that knitting is a metaphor for life, and for me life is with God, so knitting is a metaphor for our life with God.

Lace knitting is a particular art form. It takes a long time and lots of patience. There is much repetition to complete an heirloom. Many things in our everyday life are like that. I make dinner every night, walk the dog daily, keep the house neat to facilitate life (yarn that is a mess tangles and is unusable) These repetitive tasks often take more patience than I have. Yet they are the things that keep our life and family knit tightly together. My daily prayers take lots of patience and seem to take hours from my day, when the real time is only minutes and gives me so much back.

When knitting lace, how you make your stitches is critical. It matters whether your stitches lean left or right, and where you place the holes and where you bind things together. In life, I must be sure to turn left at the correct corner to find my way home. When I assist at services, how and when I do my parts are critical to the worship as a whole. I better not say the dismissal at the time for the confession! Doing my part with care and correctly helps others (and myself) toward a better worship.

Lace follows a pattern that "stacks up" with rows on top of each other. And they better match well or it will be a disaster that won't have stable form or pattern.



But the most important thing is that lace is long and precise and delicate, and it is guaranteed that at some point you will find a mistake and HAVE to *tink* (lace term meaning undo) back a fair amount. And that requires a patient, delicate, and precise undoing to a point that is uncertain. I ALWAYS put in a life-line as I am knitting, a piece of yarn that is strung along a lace row that you can always *tink* back to and find your place. It is a place of safety and surety from which to take a deep breath and have a new start. You are not lost, you have found your way back to the Divine, and can rest there and start anew.


Nativity's Film Club

Watch the movies first then join in the ZOOM meeting at 6 pm. For more information, contact Darrell at <u>darrellwspencer@yahoo.com</u>.



We were able to sponsor 22 kids at Santa Maria and give almost 150 to 200 toys to Save the Family and we received some gifts for the parents.




CASA Academy
