Dear Nativity Community:

As you may have heard at church on June 13, Vestry member Jon Bost shared the Core Values that the Vestry has discerned on their most recent retreat.

As a reminder, they are the following:

These Core Values are essentially the “DNA” of the Episcopal Church of the Nativity.

The Christopher family generously donated Bob and Marty’s book collection to Nativity in order to benefit the Summer Camp Youth Scholarships at Chapel Rock Camp and Conference Center. Once again Nativity’s dedication to Outreach is evident - The Book Drive for Chapel Rock Scholarships collected over \$2,000 which provided 5 children a wonderful experience this summer. Thank You!

On another topic, at our Vestry meeting this week, the Vestry approved the following resolution:

- For all indoor activities at the Episcopal Church of the Nativity, mask wearing will continue to be mandatory for people who are not fully vaccinated. Fully vaccinated is defined as at least 2 weeks having passed since receiving the final dose.
- Beginning on June 21st, The Episcopal Church of the Nativity will no longer require masks for those fully vaccinated gathering for worship, education, or other events. 50% of the capacity of any given room may be used, provided that social distancing can be maintained at the increased capacity.
- Congregational and choral singing can resume with unmasked fully vaccinated individuals.
- Coffee hour and events involving food may take place indoors.
- Nativity will no longer require registration for services, but greeters will need to gather contact information of all non-parishioners who attend (*for contact tracing if there is a Covid outbreak*).

We encourage anyone who feels more comfortable wearing a mask, especially those who are health-compromised, to continue to wear one. We have been extremely lucky that nobody in our parish has died of Covid, and we continue to suggest everyone protect themselves by getting a Covid vaccination.

Wayne's World May 2021

The Episcopal Church (TEC) formally adopted the lectionary of Sunday scripture texts that Nativity uses in 2006—the same year our church in Scottsdale was born. During the period of time after Pentecost in the summer of 2021 the 1st reading, typically from the Hebrew Bible or Old Testament, follows a sequential track. During this season of growth we hear readings from the books of I and II Samuel until mid-August, and then continue into the books of I and II Kings. The books of Samuel and Kings are actually a single solitary composition that is broken up into 4 books because of its massive size. Think of them as scrolls of parchment or vellum—they didn't come in "super-size."

These inspired stories of our forebears in faith cover a narrative span from the 12th to 6th Centuries BCE. The tales of the books bearing the name of the prophet and judge Samuel cover the time of the nascent monarchy, specifically the reigns of King Saul and King David.

I encourage you to open your Book of Common Prayer to pages 908 and 909 and see the scripture references of this, our 1st Lesson, over the course of June and July. Courageously read these stories (as well as the stories in between our Sunday lections) with the mind of an inquiring learner. Get curious about how the ancient community of faith would understand these narratives. Find yourself as a character inside these texts and let the Holy Spirit breath fresh life into your spirit. Experience a manifestation of God that has you go beyond the "same old, same old" to the extraordinary for once and for ever.

Centering Prayer Summer Schedule

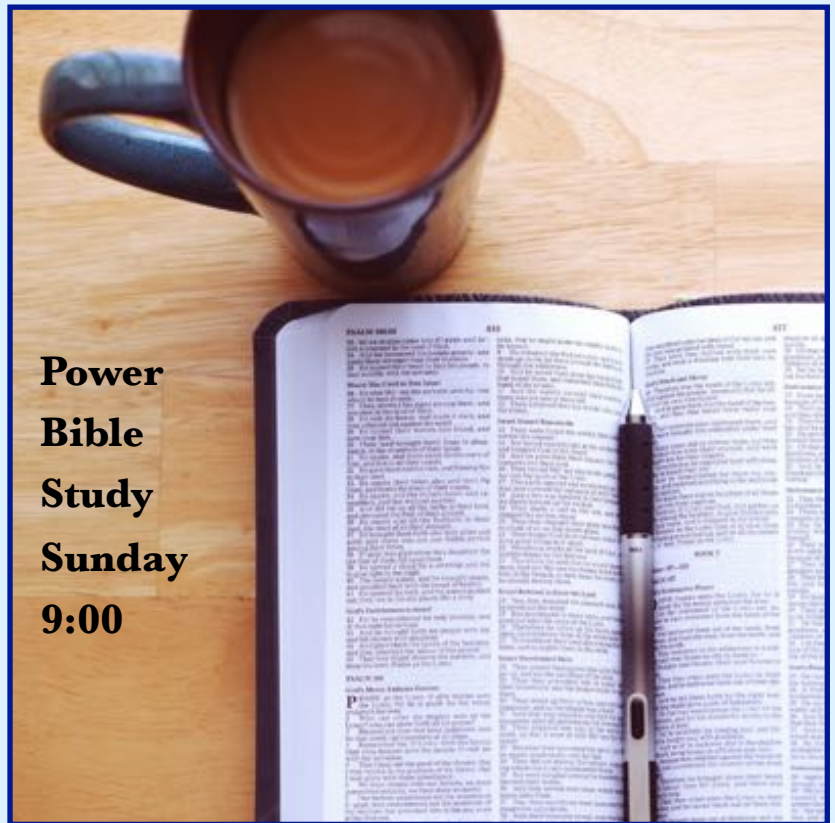

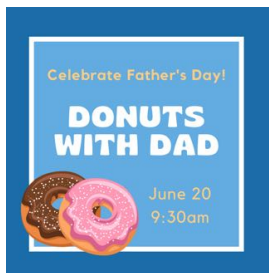

Recently I had cause to be out and around a bit as Covid restrictions relaxed and friends were vaccinated. I headed out and set off for my sewing store, which is near the new location of CASA Academy. I was headed for 35th Street and Northern, not too far, but off my usual beaten track. I was humming to the music and thinking about all the sewing notions I wanted after a long time of this store being closed. The feeling was almost twitchy as I happily tootled along. I ended up in PEORIA. I had taken the 101 all the way west instead of going down the 17. For someone from the northeast corner of the valley- Peoria is out where Jesus lost his sandals. Taking a deep breath - I punched the address in my GPS and headed east. I followed the instructions exactly and it took me on the most convoluted route possible to travel 9 miles due east. Being a rule follower, I followed every turn. I did eventually arrive, many minutes late. Well, that happens, GPS directions don't always follow my traffic intentions. It left me trying to adjust and definitely crabby.

This sort of thing happened twice again in the following weeks, once when I was headed to downtown Phoenix I landed in Moon Valley. Enough said, I am obviously out of sorts and often crabby.

Silly as this seems, I think it's a metaphor for many people as Covid is retreating and we are venturing farther afield. Normal everyday routines are done differently, taking us through odd ways of doing routine tasks. Like the odd places my GPS took me. I knew I was headed in the correct direction, but old patterns of place and time and direction seemed wrong. I got there, but it was a bit off pattern. This manifests in different ways. One friend mentioned she felt very odd on an escalator recently. She noticed the odd jerky movements they make, sensations she glossed over a year or so ago. It left her feeling peculiar. I didn't ask her if she was crabby. Old routine things, with a bit of difference. Off-kilter makes me uneasy.

I think it's not uncommon to be uneasy, or anxious, or even crabby in this changing time. I try to have compassion with those who are adjusting, and compassion with myself too.

Church is like this too. We are gathered together happily-and the liturgy remains the same. It is a lovely service and it is a joy to be together, but it still takes a little getting used to. I can't even articulate what is so different - I'm working on remembering that compassion part. I love seeing everyone, learning new patterns and new driving directions but it does help to name it out loud, "Things are a bit different." I do not want to be crabby. I want to thrive on different. I want to say, yep, that's how it is now, and it's good. Life is Good. Keep the compassion coming. Thanks be to God for new patterns in life. Peace to all,

They are also in need of career clothing for the women. If you have any you would like to donate, please reach out to Kathy Graf via email at kgraf518@aol.com.

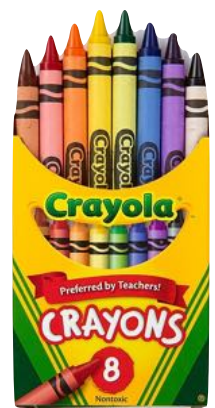


CASA Academy School Supply Drive

At The Episcopal Church of the Nativity, reaching out to others is not just a Christian responsibility, it's a passion! This spirit is captured in the Outreach Committee's Mission Statement:

"To inspire and equip every member of Nativity to participate in ministries that touch those in need."

We are blessed to be able to help many different organizations in our community and internationally – truly watching lives being transformed with the love of Jesus Christ. For information about any of these ministries, please contact our Ministry Leader for Outreach, Cindy Cohen, or the specific ministry leaders listed for each project.

Native American Ministries – Nativity Church is part of the Council for Native American Ministries, a group within the Arizona Episcopal Diocese that helps to meet the needs of some of the 22 Federally recognized tribes in the state of Arizona. Projects can range from food and pillow drives, making masks for smaller tribes threatened by Covid-19, or raising funds to help senior Native Americans ensure they have food and toiletries. Barrio La Laguna – In the poverty-stricken barrio of Veracruz, Mexico, is an Episcopal church, Santa Maria Magdalena, our sister and companion church. They have a special mission to the children of the barrio. They feed, provide medical care, and educate many children every day, giving them a start in life, hope for the future, and much-needed academic and vocational training. In the past, we have partnered with them to help build their new Community Center, the home for the church and school. Currently we provide scholarship funds, and funds for maintenance of their building.

CASA Academy Food Packs – CASA Academy is a charter elementary school serving some of Phoenix's poorest students and distinguishes itself by providing rigorous instruction in academics and character development. CASA ensures that all scholars are at or above grade-level at the end of each year, unlike many of their peers from similar backgrounds. Close to 100% of the scholars are eligible for free or reduced lunch; from there, the school further identifies children that come from food-insecure homes, meaning there is no guarantee of food being available outside of school. Nativity provides weekend food for these students.
