If you're looking for the meaning of life, then you're wanting wisdom. It is a basic interest of all humanity, regardless of nationality. King Solomon's blank check from God had the word "wisdom" on the memo line. Israel managed to exist in a perilous position between Egypt and Babylonia, both of which had their own long-standing wisdom traditions. The sages of the day put forth practical advice based, not in religious cult, but in experiences of observed life. The literature of the Bible which falls into the category of Wisdom can be categorized into 2 camps: Advice for the young on how to lead a profitable life, and narrative which probes the depths of human anguish.

Our Old Testament lessons turn to the Wisdom side of scripture in September with samplings from Proverbs. The wisdom we see in the Bible is remarkably unconcerned with religion or religiosity. This literature reflects the direction of human being when we truly consider what all creation shares in common. Reacquaint yourself with the wisdom writings of the Bible like Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Job. Find yourself challenged with viewpoints that you don't agree with. Experience yourself once again transformed and even renewed.

Bible Study Wednesday


The ongoing "teach through the Bible" series continues on Wednesday nights.



Workshops Session 1

WS1A - Nancy Frausto - El Evangelismo Episcopal al sabor Latino

We can captivate the hearts and minds of the “never-ending scrollers” by cutting through the noise using meaningful content through the art of storytelling. Church resources are often spread thin, but implementing effective communications doesn’t need to be complicated. In this workshop, we will dive into the world of websites, social media and email marketing. This workshop aims to fill up your cup with much needed inspiration for the task at hand. Join me in elevating the church mission through digital evangelism.

WS1C - The Revs. Hunter Ruffin & Erika von Haaren - Post-Pandemic Evangelism: Discernment + Strategic Planning = the Future

Through the practices of showing up in our community and learning the stories of our neighbors, the church can be open to welcoming the stranger in new and creative ways. In this workshop, we will discuss how strategic thinking/planning and the intentional embodying of God's love helps us to live into the vocation of being fishers of people.

WS1D - John Caleb Collins & Devin Gillespie - Into the Cosmos: Carrying Out Service and Mission to Others

An engaging and lively interactive discussion of what it means to be the body of Christ--His hands and feet--in the community around us, as we are called to receive and be the Real Presence of Christ for the world.

WS1E - Canon Anita Braden - Rise up and Reach Out!

An informative discussion for believers of Christ to be His reflection in the world and share the Good News of Jesus, the Christ.



Workshop Session 2

WS2A - Nancy Frausto - Evangelism: Going out into the neighborhood

Using the Episcopal definition for evangelism: As we seek, name, and celebrate Jesus' loving presence in the stories of others and invite them to more, we must be sure that our faith communities are places where we are inviting people to be ministry partners. Join us for an evangelism workshop focused on "How we go out into our neighborhood," "how we meet and receive new people from different cultures and backgrounds into our church," and "how we can build authentic respectful relationships with our neighbors." This workshop will focus on practical tools for going out into our neighborhoods (this will include social media presence), telling our faith story, actively listening to others tell their story, and finally, how faith communities can grow and thrive by embracing evangelism.

WS2B - Anti-Racism Committee - "Powerful Conversations on Stewardship of Privilege: Exploring our Power of Privilege in Service of Beloved Community"

Participants will reflect on the practice of taking hold of the power of privilege and using it to disarm, dismantle, or otherwise subvert what is was designed to protect. We will be referencing ideas and materials from Stephanie Spellers' new book, *The Church Cracked Open: Disruption, Decline, and Hope for Beloved Community*. It is not necessary to read the book in advance.

WS2C - Robin Hollis & Mary Hovden - Survive, Thrive, Evangelize: Collaborating for Success through the UTO COVID-19 Digital Ministry Grant

Topics include streaming equipment choices, music licensing & compliance, tips & tricks for streaming/recording to Facebook and YouTube. During Holy Week 2020 our world changed forever. As churches closed to in-person worship and activities because of rising COVID-19 cases, we had to adapt and change immediately in order to keep our congregations connected and fulfill congregant spiritual needs. This interactive worship will cover how St. James the Apostle, Tempe took the lead in obtaining a special COVID-19 UTO grant for streaming equipment. We'll also discuss the process we used to obtain the grant, how we collaborated with 18 other AZ congregations to implement the grant, what we learned and how our experiences can benefit your streaming journey.

WS2D - The Rev Canon Jana Sundin - Evangelism with Children, Youth and Young Adults

This workshop will explore how congregations can partner with and empower children, youth, and young adults--both within and outside of the church--to participate in God's mission of reconciling love.

WS2E - Paul Sheehan, Dennis Combs & Robbie Tantimonaco – Spouse & Partner Program

Come and join other clergy spouses and partners for a time of sharing and fellowship.

EASIEST KIDS HAT EVER KNITTING PATTERN

Yarn: Vanna's Choice in Midnight Blue

Needles: Size US 8 straight

Gauge= 1 inch = 4 sts

Sizes (hat is very stretchy): 1-3 years, 4-7

Cast on 76 (80) sts. Work in K2, P2 ribbing until hat measures 12 (13) inches from the cast on edge. Bind off. For the tie: Chain 40 with crochet hook G or cast on 2 sts and garter stitch for 10 inches.

Fold over and sew the side seam.

Crochet or knit the tie

Tie tightly around the top of the hat.



And the best part of this ministry is the warm feeling you have when you leave. The men are always so grateful, and we always come away knowing that we have received more than we have given.
