Parish Growth and Welcoming Church Survey Results October 2021 Jim Graves

During the last few weeks, we have heard from members of our church about their personal stories of thankfulness and gratitude for our Nativity community of faith and family as part our stewardship drive. These experiences of life, love and faith also reverberate through the results of a church survey completed in June.

On June 27, 2021 many attending church participated in a church survey and during the week that followed others also responded. The purpose of the survey was for the Parish Growth and Welcoming Committee to understand who we are as a community of faith and why people choose to attend the Church of the Nativity.

Simple questions were asked, such as: How did you learn about Nativity? What do you most enjoy about attending services at Nativity? What are you thankful for about Nativity? How would you best describe our church to a friend or neighbor? Are there other activities we can offer to attract people to our church? There were 52 respondents.

Members have learned about our church through family and friends already attending, personal invitation, driving by and seeing the building, and finding the church on the internet. Respondents indicated they most enjoy our worship services, music program, outreach ministries, our clergy, and social activities. Many of those with children also highlighted children's ministries.

There were hundreds of responses to the open-ended questions. What people were thankful for and what they share about Nativity to others blended together. Many people indicated they were thankful for Nativity being welcoming, friendly, caring, loving, warm, open, and accepting. Others were thankful that Nativity is a warm and loving family of faith and place to worship. People were also thankful for outreach ministry opportunities. There were any ideas for attracting new growth which the Welcoming Committee will take under consideration, but there was a trend in the responses of returning to as many of the in-person activities Nativity offers, as soon as we are safely able to do so as we move through the Covid-19 pandemic. We already have restarted the One's and Two's monthly gatherings, the choir is starting rehearsals and will be singing soon, and the 8am church service begins in just a few weeks.

- We Promote Spiritual Growth through our Worship Services, Christian Education, and Community Events.

- We Provide a Christ-centered environment in which families are offered a supportive community and spiritual growth as they journey through parenthood, school years, and beyond.
- We Embrace and Encourage a broad Arts Program.
- We Operate our parish in a Fiscally Sound Manner.

Sound familiar? They are the core values of our church. The survey supports how important our core values are in our common worship and life together as we reflect the love of Christ in our daily lives.

Bible Study Wednesday

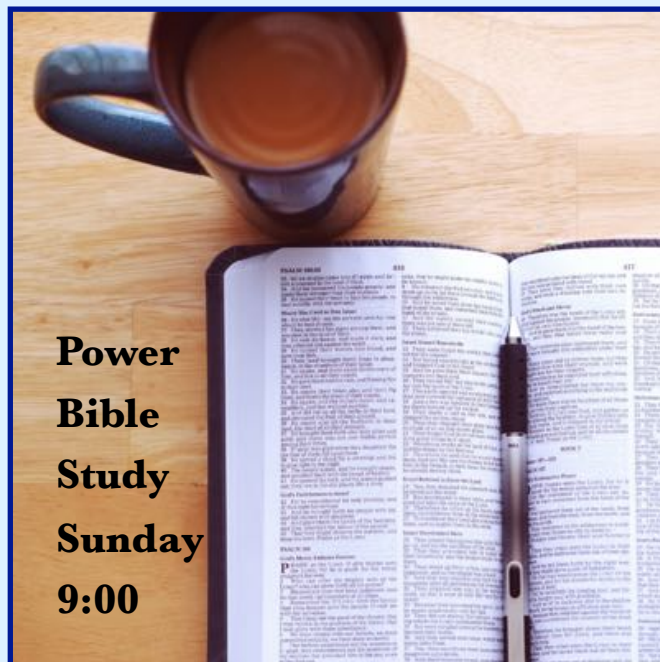
The ongoing "teach through the Bible" series continues on Wednesday nights. September begins a foray into the books of the Latter Prophets--those

Westward Expansion: favorites from the Railroad stop era

Enjoy the luxurious harmonies found in Alexandre Guilmant's First Organ Sonata, the *Sturm und Drang* of Philipp Wolfrum's Third Organ Sonata, Théodore Dubois' exciting Toccata, a gentle Pastorale from William

Faulkes and a Civil War era transcription of "When Johnny Comes Marching Home" by Edwin Lemare. These late nineteenth-century favorites were once staples of organ recitals performed for travellers heading to the American West on the railroad. Valerie Harris, Guest Recitalist at the Tabernacle on Temple Square in Salt Lake City, frequently performs in that venue's recital series established over a hundred years ago for tourists travelling the railroad through the Western U.S.

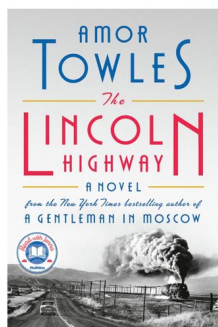

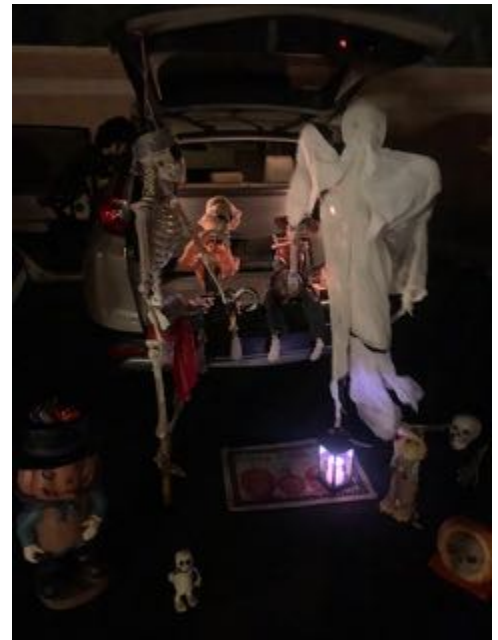
